

Minimal Supplies & Safety

Make a Plan. Get ready. Be safe.



Before the storm



Download the Rick Case Hurricane Preparedness Guide



Bottled Water (2 gallons per person per day)



Non-perishable food (3-5 days for everyone)



Have an extra supply of batteries



Plastic dishes. eating untensils



Pet Supplies (food, leash, carrier, vaccination records)



First Aid Kit (including prescription medications)



Bedding & Clothing for each family member if evacuatiog to shelter



Soap, shampoo, other personal hygiene items



Portable NOAA Weather capable



Rain Jackets, pants, waterproof boots



Toothbrush, toothpaste & other oral hygiene items



Flashlight(s) with extra batteries



Blankets, towels if evacuating to shelter



Important Documents (Driver's license, social security card, proof of residence, insurance policies, wills, deeds, birth and marriage certificates, tax records, medical records,



Extra cash for purchases after the storm/power outage



Baby supplies (food, diapers, medication)



Sunscreen, sunglasses,

mosquito repellent

water tight container)



Mobile device chargers & USB batteries to use during power outage



Hand Sanitizer

The suggested supplies above should be used as a starting point in preparing you and your family for hurricane season. Above is not all-inclusive, and each individual/family will need to determine what supplies are needed and then prepare accordingly.

After the storm safety



Avoid driving to keep roads clear for emergency vehicles



Never place a generator inside a home or garage. Place outside, away from windows and doors



After a flood, water may be contaminated. Disinfect water by a rolling boiling for 5 minutes or add 8 drops of bleach for gallon of water



Avoid downed power lines, especially when cutting or clearing fallen trees/limbs



Never walk or drive through flood waters. Avoid hazards that may be below the surface of the water



Beware of wildlife driven to higher ground by flood waters
